QUIZ

Thank you for hosting a quiz in support of Nottingham Hospitals Charity. Our quiz pack is designed to make it easy for you to host a quiz, either in person or virtually. We've provided ten rounds of questions and answers (you don't have to use them all!), a joker card, and some tips on how to host a great quiz night. We've also included some extra ideas to make your event more fun.

BEFORE YOUR QUIZ

- Choose a time and date.
- Choose a venue or book a virtual get together.
- Consider refreshments. Will you provide any food and drink or can people bring their own? Does your venue provide refreshments?
- Invite people to come along – friends, family, colleagues, community groups...
- Choose a Quizmaster.
- Print out your materials. Gather paper and pens.
- Source your prizes.
- Prepare for any other fundraising activities on the night.

Have fun!

THE QUIZMASTER

Make sure that you are familiar with the questions and answers before the event. Decide how many rounds you are going to do.

Make sure people are in teams of relatively equal size. If you're doing the quiz with work colleagues, why not pit different departments against each other? Or mix up departments so people meet new colleagues?

At the start of the evening, make sure that you let everyone know what to expect – how many rounds there will be, how many questions in each round, when you will give out the answers and how they will mark the quiz.

Make it clear that you don't want any cheating! You might want to ban the use of mobile phones during the questions.

Make sure that everyone has paper and a pen, can hear the questions and is sitting with their team members.

Ask each team to choose a team name. Ask them to shout it out and make a note of it – you could even give a prize for the best name.

Make sure you leave enough time for teams to have a discussion and answer the questions. You can ask if anyone needs a question repeated.

Get teams to self-mark or swap their answer sheet with a neighbouring team. You may want to do this after each round, or after a few rounds, it's up to you. Collect in the answer sheets and keep a record of the scores. You may want someone to help with this.

At the halfway point, give out the scores so far. If it's close, you might want to do so again before the final round.

You might want to take a break halfway through to give people chance to stretch their legs, get some refreshments, or take part in any other fundraising activities.

Remember – the Quizmaster has the final say on any debate or argument regarding the correct answer.

THE JOKER

It's up to you if you want to use the Joker card. If you do choose to use it then make sure that you explain how to use it at the beginning of the quiz.

Each team is given a Joker card. It is played at the beginning of a round of the team's choice, and for that round only the team doubles their score. The team needs to let the Quizmaster know when they are playing the card, usually after the category has been revealed and before the first question has been asked. Teams should choose to play the Joker for the round they think they are strongest at, thus maximising their scoring potential.

In NHC's 15-year history, they have funded all kinds of improvements including:

- New facilities, family-friendly wards and comfortable environments for visitors
- The latest specialist equipment, such as state-of-the-art ultrasound scanners
- Medical research for a variety of conditions, such as breast cancer, dementia and osteoarthritis
- Innovative staff leadership and development programmes that help hospital staff provide the best possible care.

This is your chance to say thank you to our incredible NHS workers, whether they have cared for you as a patient, looked after a loved one or have inspired you in your local community.

If you have chosen to support a specific ward or area of Nottingham hospitals, or a specific Appeal, then let us know and we can provide you with more information about the work we are doing in that area. We can also provide a (very) short video about our work that you could show at your event.

**Keep reminding people to donate!
And thank them for taking part.**

FUNDRAISING IDEAS

- Ask people to make a **donation** to enter the quiz. You could ask for a donation per person or per team. You may choose to use a percentage of these donations as a prize. Alternatively, you may be able to source a prize from a local business.
- Hold a **raffle** on the night. You don't always need lots of prizes, but one or two good prizes could get people to dig deep. If you have some really good prizes then you could auction them to raise even more money.
- Offer **food and drink**. You could sell cakes or snacks to raise more money on the night. If you are using a venue, ask them to donate some of their takings from the event.
- You could set up a **JustGiving** page to raise money for the quiz. Provide people with the link before and during the event to encourage donations.
- Play **heads or tails**. Everyone stands up and either puts their hands on their heads or their 'tail'. Flip a coin and announce what side the coin lands on:
 - If it lands on heads, everyone with their hands on their heads is out and must sit down
 - If it lands on tails, everyone with their hands on their tail is out and must sit down.

Everyone who is left then chooses again whether they put their hands on their heads or tails. This continues until there is one person left who is the winner! Charge £1 (or more) to enter. Winner gets half and keep the other half for the Charity.

- Organise a **sweepstake**. You could get people to make a donation to guess the winning score, or guess the number of sweets in a jar or similar.

EXTRA QUIZ IDEAS

- Add a **picture quiz** round. You can source photos or images online, such as famous people or buildings.
- Add a **music round** with actual music. You can play clips from songs and ask people to name the song, the artist or to remember the next line.
- Ask people to provide a photo of themselves as a baby and '**Guess the Baby**' as one of the quiz rounds.
- You could challenge each team to do something **interactive** and give points for the best results. For example, they could build something out of marshmallows and cocktail sticks, or toilet rolls or newspaper.
- Use a **screen or projector** to display your questions or have rounds with film clips or pictures on a big screen.
